

RESOLUTION NO. 2015- 1960

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO GRANT AGREEMENTS WITH THE OHIO DEVELOPMENT SERVICES AGENCY FOR PROGRAM YEAR 2015 COMMUNITY HOUSING IMPACT AND PRESERVATION (CHIP) PROGRAM AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the State of Ohio has funds available through the Community Housing Impact and Preservation (CHIP) Program for dissemination to eligible cities and counties on a formula basis, and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Department of Development has determined the City of Fremont is eligible for funds in the total amount of \$850,000 (\$353,000 from the State Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program, \$447,000 from the Home Investment Partnership Program, and \$50,000 from the Low and Moderate Income (LMI) Housing Trust Fund (HST).


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FREMONT, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into Grant Agreements with the Ohio Development Services Agency for the Program Year 2015 Community Housing Impact and Preservation (CHIP) Program for the State Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program, the Home Investment Partnership Program and the Low and Moderate Income (LMI) Housing Trust Fund (HST), and

SECTION 2. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Revised Code of Ohio, and

SECTION 3. The immediate operation of the provisions of this resolution is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Fremont. Said emergency being the need to sign and return the grant agreements to Ohio Development Services Agency to be considered timely for submission.

This resolution, provided it receives a two-thirds yea or nay vote of all the members elected to the Fremont City Council, is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and this resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council of the City of Fremont, approval by the Mayor, and publication and posting as required by law.





