Journal of Council

April 4, 2013

The regular meeting of Fremont City Council was called to order at 7:30 p.m. in the form prescribed by the General Rules of Council, with President James Weaver presiding.

The following members answered roll call: Knisely, Marker, and Ruiz. Nalley was on vacation. Leake and Kreilick were sick.

The minutes of the March 21, 2013 meeting were approved as written and received.

Second reading of a resolution authorizing the approval and issuance of a warrant for payment of \$19,364.00 to Ohio Water Development Authority, and declaring an emergency.

First reading of a resolution authorizing the approval and issuance of a warrant for payment of \$11,194.00 to Etna Supply, and declaring an emergency.

First reading of an ordinance authorizing the mayor to enter into an agreement with Volunteer Energy to obtain natural gas services for the city, state of Ohio, and declaring an emergency.

First reading of a resolution authorizing the mayor to enter into a grant agreement with OSS Solid Waste District, and declaring an emergency.

First reading of an ordinance to authorize the expenditure and direct the safety service director to enter into a contract with ODOT Cooperative Purchasing Program in the amount of \$52.50 per ton for a maximum of 1,200 tons of salt for the 2013-14 winter season, and declaring an emergency.

Committee reports

Marker reported that the Rec Board will meet April 8 at 7 p.m. at the Rec Center.

Knisely said he expects to have report at council's next meeting.

Council Comments

Ruiz said that at the last meeting she had asked Root about gas line inspection mailings she had received and that he recommended she did schedule such inspections. She said she did and is awaiting the inspectors at her home.

Auditor Paul Grahl reported that he won't be at council's next meeting.


