

ORDINANCE NO. 2018-3935

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE PAY SCALE FOR ALL PART-TIME, INTERMITTENT, TEMPORARY, SEASONAL AND INTERIM EMPLOYEES, AND BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS OF THE CITY OF FREMONT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FREMONT, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. A pay scale shall be established for all part-time, intermittent, temporary and seasonal employees and the Civil Service Commission of the City of Fremont effective January 1, 2019, as follows:


SECTION 2. The pay for interim employees shall be set by the appointing authority. Such rate shall be no higher than that of the vacant permanent position as authorized by the current full time wage ordinance.

SECTION 3. All prior ordinances are hereby repealed and/or amended only to the extent they are inconsistent with this ordinance.

SECTION 4. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Revised Code of Ohio.

SECTION 5. The immediate operation of the provisions of this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Fremont. Said emergency being the need to reflect the minimum wage change effective January 1, 2019.

This ordinance, provided it receives a two-thirds yea or nay vote of all the members elected to the Fremont City Council, is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council of the City of Fremont, approval by the Mayor, and publication and posting as required by law.
